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




K-12 Enrollment - District 1-32 and Charter Schools

- Enrollment in D1-32 schools decreased slightly in 2024-2025, remaining relatively stable compared to the steeper declines following the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Citywide, K-12 enrollment in District 1-32 schools and charter schools has declined by about 10% since its peak in the 2016-2017 school year.

Grade 9-12 Enrollment by Borough and Year (District Schools Only)



2024-25 Brooklyn High School Enrollment by District (District Schools Only)



• Between 2019-20 and 2024-25, eight of Brooklyn's districts experienced high school enrollment decline, whereas four districts showed growth or remained stable.

• District 16 had the steepest enrollment decline during this time, from 1,708 in 2019-20 to 1,373 in 2024-25 (20% decline).

• Overall, Brooklyn's high school residential population remained relatively stable between 2019-20 and 2024-25.

- During this time, six of Brooklyn's districts experienced some degree of population decline, whereas six districts grew in population or remained relatively stable.
- District 17 had the steepest population decline, going from 10,543 students in grades 9-12 in 2019-20 to 9,415 students in 2024-25 (11% decline)

• In 2024-25, 56% of students living in 2019-20 enrolled in a district high school in the borough, about the same as in 2019-20. District 20 received 10% of students living in Brooklyn, the highest percentage of Brooklyn districts.

• About 22% of Brooklyn student residents enrolled in non-public schools (about the same as in 2019-20) and 7% enrolled in charter schools (about the same as in 2019-20).



NYCPS's District 75 provides specialized instructional support for students with significant challenges, such as Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD), significant cognitive delays, emotional disability, sensory impairment, and multiple disabilities. District 75 serves students through a number of different program models.

• Most District 75 students attend Special Class programs, which operate as distinct schools and may be located in standalone sites or co-located with district schools.

• A smaller number of students attend Inclusion Programs, in which students receive District 75 services within general education classes at a district school partner.




