Guiding Policies and Principles

- Pending approval by the CEC, the proposed changes would take effect for the 2012-13 academic year.
- Pending approval by the CEC, the proposed changes would only impact incoming Kindergarten or new students to the system. All currently enrolled students may remain in their school until graduation.
- <u>Sibling Priority</u> Current sibling enrollment policies would remain in effect. Additionally, **children currently living in the PS 101 zone who would be zoned to another school as a result of this proposal would retain their enrollment status as an in-zone sibling** as long as they have an older sibling attending PS 101 in grades 1-5 during the year in which the student would enroll in kindergarten.



Methodology: Target Kindergarten Zone Size


Determining Target Kindergarten Zone Sizes:

- Enrollment data
- Zoned retention rate of each school
 - How many students who live in the zone attend their zoned school?
- What is the capacity of each school?
 - Specifically, what is the number of possible sections of kindergarten in each building, based on the number of full-size classrooms; and appropriate number of cluster rooms.


Rationale for Rezoning

- Space constraints at P.S. 101 are severe
 - History of capping and overflow across multiple grades
 - Potential negative impact of continued overcrowding
 - Least disruptive option
 - Will not impact any family currently enrolled at P.S. 101
 - Allows schools and families to plan for predictable enrollment,
 rather than resort to capping and overflow each Fall
- Excess seat capacity at P.S. 212

Appendix: Admissions Process

- **First Priority** Zoned students with verified siblings who will be enrolled in grades 1-5 in the school as of September 2012
- **Second Priority** Zoned students without siblings applying to the zoned school
- **Third Priority** Non-zoned students with verified siblings who will be enrolled in grades 1-5 in the school as of September 2012:
 - a. Within district first, then
 - b. Out of district
- Fourth Priority Non-zoned students without siblings:
 - a. Within district first, then
 - b. Out of district

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^{*}Current in-zone siblings who would be zoned out based on the proposed lines will be grandfathered as an in-zone sibling.
