


CITYWIDE SPECIAL CLASS ENROLLMENT, 2017-18 TO 2022-23



 The number of District 75 students in special classes has increased by approximately 9% in the last five years.

District 75 Special Class Enrollment by Borough 2020-21 to 2022-23



- In the Bronx, the number of students enrolled in District 75 special classes declined between the 2020-2021 and 2022-2023 school years.
- In contrast, the number of students in District 75 special classes increased in both Queens (3%) and Staten Island (4%) over the same period.

DISTRICT PLANNING PROCESS

- The Office of District Planning partners with superintendents and communities to address
 district needs in accordance with Chancellor's Regulation A-190, which governs the process to
 make any major changes to school utilization such as co-locations and re-sitings. A-190
 proposals are voted on by the Panel for Educational Policy (PEP).
- The tables below show all District 75-related proposals approved by the PEP that are implementing in the 2022-2023 and 2023-2024 school years, as well as new sites in new or standalone buildings, which are not subject to the A-190 process.



- During the 2023-2024 school year, the Office of District Planning anticipates identifying space for expanding existing District 75 programs and/or opening new sites for implementation in September 2024.


DISTRICT 75 ENROLLMENT BY RESIDENTIAL DISTRICT

District 75 ES Residents, 2022-23




• The above chart shows the number of District 75 elementary school residents by district who receive special class services.

DISTRICT 75 SPECIAL CLASS SEAT NEED

- This section shows special class students and seats on the borough level and district levels, not including changes planned to implement in the 2022-2023 school year and beyond.
- District 75 placements are assessed on a borough basis, with consideration for students' individual special education needs, physical accessibility requirements, and district of residence, as well as seat availability and whether the student has a sibling at a specific site.
- Guiding Questions:
 - o Does the district have a need for more District 75 seats?
 - Are there potential options for new D75 sites to provide opportunities for students to attend programs closer to their homes?



- Based on 2022-23 data, each borough has enough seats on aggregate compared with the total number of District 75 students in special classes. However, because seat student enrollment and capacity varies across each borough, district-level enrollment and seat need data help illustrate which districts may be in need of additional seats.
- In all districts, the need for specific, recommended program types, class sizes, and grade levels may not align with existing capacity and the overall excess or deficit of seats.
 - This is especially relevant in District 31 (Staten Island), where District 75 students have less access to programs in other boroughs due to geography.

DISTRICT 75 ES SEAT NEED BY DISTRICT

 The charts below compare the number of District 75 special class seats at the elementary, middle school, and high school levels within a given district with the number of district residents who require District 75 special class services, and includes districts that show a deficit of seats in 2022-2023.




District 75 ES Seat Need, 2022-23

- In 2022-2023, District 9 in the Bronx had the largest special class seat deficit at the ES level (330).
- New D75 programs sited in 2021-2022 in Districts 18 and 28 helped reduce the ES seat deficit in those
 districts and a new program in District 30 helped eliminate the previous seat deficit there (see p. 4 for
 full listing).
- A new D75 ES program sited in District 22 at K203 in the 2022-2023 school year helped reduce the
 district's 181 seat deficit. A new program at M028 opened in the current school year to help address
 the ES seat need in District 6 and is also an accessible option for nearby District 5.


In 2022-2023, District 27 in Queens had the largest special class seat deficit at the MS level (153).

■ Special Class Seats ■ Seat Deficit

- A new D75 MS program sited in 2021-2022 in District 29 helped reduce the seat deficit from 161 in 2020-2021 to 94 in 2021-2022. (see p. 4 for full listing).
- A new D75 MS program sited in 2022-2023 in District 10 helped eliminate the district's previous seat D75 seat deficit at the MS level (see p. 4 for full listing).
- New middle school building Q419 opened in District 24 for the 2022-2023 school year with capacity for 96 District 75 seats.

- District 9 in the Bronx continues to have the largest special class seat deficit at the HS level (422).
- Program expansions at existing D75 programs in Districts 8 and 19 helped reduce HS seat deficits in both districts.
- The new high school D75 programs that opened in District 6 at M218 and in District 18 at K415 in the current 2023-2024 school year will help address the seat need captured in those districts.

DISTRICT 75 CAPACITY PROJECTS

- The table below reflects District 75 projects and new capacity projects with designed District 75 seats, per the NYC School Construction Authority as of July 2023.
- District 75 capacity for these projects is based on a maximum capacity figure of 12 students per class; the actual number of seats may be smaller if classes with lower class sizes are opened in these new buildings.
